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Developing Healthy Lifestyles through Baseball

Sports is one of the most common activities participated in by youth. Townhall II worked with the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) to develop a youth sports program aimed at preventing substance use and promoting healthy lifestyles. This was a 16-week program, held January through May of 2023 at Joseph and Florence Mandel Jewish Day School, that combined learning the fundamental skills of baseball and evidence-based education on substance use prevention using the Too Good for Drugs curriculum.

In addition to learning how to play the game of baseball, students in 3rd and 4th grade also learned about healthy choices, making good decisions, positive teamwork and healthy friendships, good sportsmanship and managing emotions. Students and staff also worked on skills that help build confidence.

Kodie McCully, a case manager at Townhall II, said, "It was rewarding watching multiple kids, who did not know how to hold a baseball at the beginning of the program, be able to catch and throw a baseball by the end of the 16 weeks; they learned the fundamentals of the game. It is always special getting to see kids work together and take direction for the good of the group."

Townhall II hopes that this experience will lead to more opportunities to provide this programming here in Portage County, helping more youth develop healthy lifestyles free from the use of substances.
