## CARE Community Award of Appreciation for 2023

The Mental Health & Recovery Board received the CARE Community Award of Appreciation for 2023 from the Chemical Abuse Reduced by Education (CARE) Committee of the Six District Educational Compact. ## **Denim Day**

Denim Day began in Italy in 1992, when an 18-year old girl was raped by the 45-year old driving instructor who was taking her on her very first driving lesson. He took her to an isolated road, pulled her out of the car, removed her jeans, and forcefully raped her.

She reported the rape, and the perpetrator was arrested and prosecuted. He is convicted of rape and sentenced to jail. Years later, he appealed the conviction claiming that he and the girl had consensual sex. The Italian Supreme Court overturned the conviction, and the perpetrator was released. A statement from the Court argued that because the victim was wearing very tight jeans, she had to help him remove them, and by removing the jeans it was not rape but consensual sex. This became known throughout Italy as the "jeans alibi."

The women in the Italian Parliament were enraged by this statement and launched a protest wearing jeans on the steps of the Supreme Court. This protest caught the eye of international media which then inspired the California Senate and Assembly to do the same on the steps of the Capitol in Sacramento. Patti Occhiuzzo Giggans, Executive Director of Peace Over Violence, saw this in the media and thought everyone should be wearing jeans to protest the myths about why women and girls are raped. Denim Day was born. The first Denim Day in LA event was in April of 1999, and has continued annually since.

April 26th was Denim Day and Townhall II held a Denim Day event on the evening of April 25th at their Ravenna office. Members of the community, survivors, youth, the Kent State University SRVSS office, and Townhall II staff decorated denim squares which will be sewn into a quilt and displayed for future Denim Days to come! We would like to thank all that came out to support the event and the meaning behind it!
